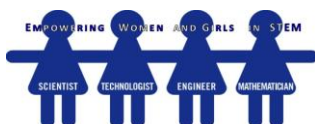

## Program Details

### ➤ Keynote Speaker

#### **Dr Imogen R. Coe - “Embedding Equity, Delivering Diversity, Saving Science”**

Dr. Imogen R. Coe has written and spoken extensively on the issue of equity, diversity and inclusion in STEM in Canada, nationally and internationally and is a sought after speaker and advisor in this area. She is the Dean of the Faculty of Science Ryerson University and Affiliate Scientist in the Li Ka Shing Knowledge Institute, Keenan Research Centre at St. Michael’s Hospital Toronto. She is a cell biologist whose research focuses on the basic biology of a class of drug transport proteins and their roles in clinical settings. In the fall of 2016, she was recognized by the Women’s Executive Network (WXN) as one of Canada’s Top 100 Women, in the Trailblazer category, for her advocacy work in promoting equity in STEM.

### ➤ Sessions

#### **A) Cindy Adams - “Scientists in School: Preparing Canadian Youth for their Future”**

Cindy Adams is the Executive Director of Scientists in School. Her unwavering commitment to science and education has been behind the organization's evolution from a local grassroots CFUW initiative, to the leading science education charity it is today. Every young Canadian deserves to finish high school prepared and inspired to be successful in the 21<sup>st</sup> century. How can all of us – parents, concerned citizens, teachers, and community-focused organizations – help to ensure that all Canadian students have access to the kind of STEM learning that engages them in real-world experiences that spark their curiosity, and nurture their inquisitive minds?

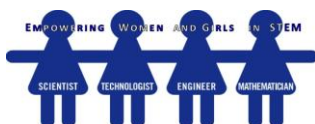
#### **B) Diana P. Trepkov - "Faceless, Voiceless: From Search to Closure, a Forensic Artist's Inspirational Approach to the Missing and Unidentified"**

Diana P. Trepkov is a forensic artist, a wildlife artist, author and lecturer. Throughout Canada and the United States, Diana has been involved in 208 law enforcement cold cases to date. She has reconstructed the faces of the crew of the 1845 lost Franklin expedition from their skulls. She has worked on missing and murdered persons cases. She is an advocate for the homeless, missing persons and crimes against children. Diana has published 3 children's books whose mission is to help prevent children from going missing.

#### **C) Automotive Centre of Excellence (ACE) –Climatic Wind Tunnel Tour**

The ACE research and testing facility offers chambers and technology for climatic, structural durability and life-cycle testing. Facilities include one of the largest and most sophisticated climatic wind tunnels on the planet.

In the Climatic Wind Tunnel, wind speeds can reach 300 kilometres per hour with temperatures that range from -40 to +60 degrees C. With the solar arrays and storm generators any weather conditions imaginable can be created, from sweltering jungle downpours to the paralyzing cold of an arctic storm. The chambers are used to test automotive and aerospace products, to improve the performance of elite athletes and to provide services to many other markets, including the Unmanned Aerial Vehicle industry, film and television and motorsports.

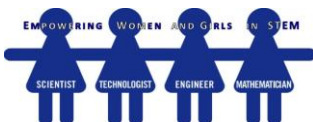

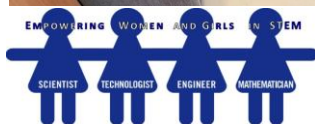

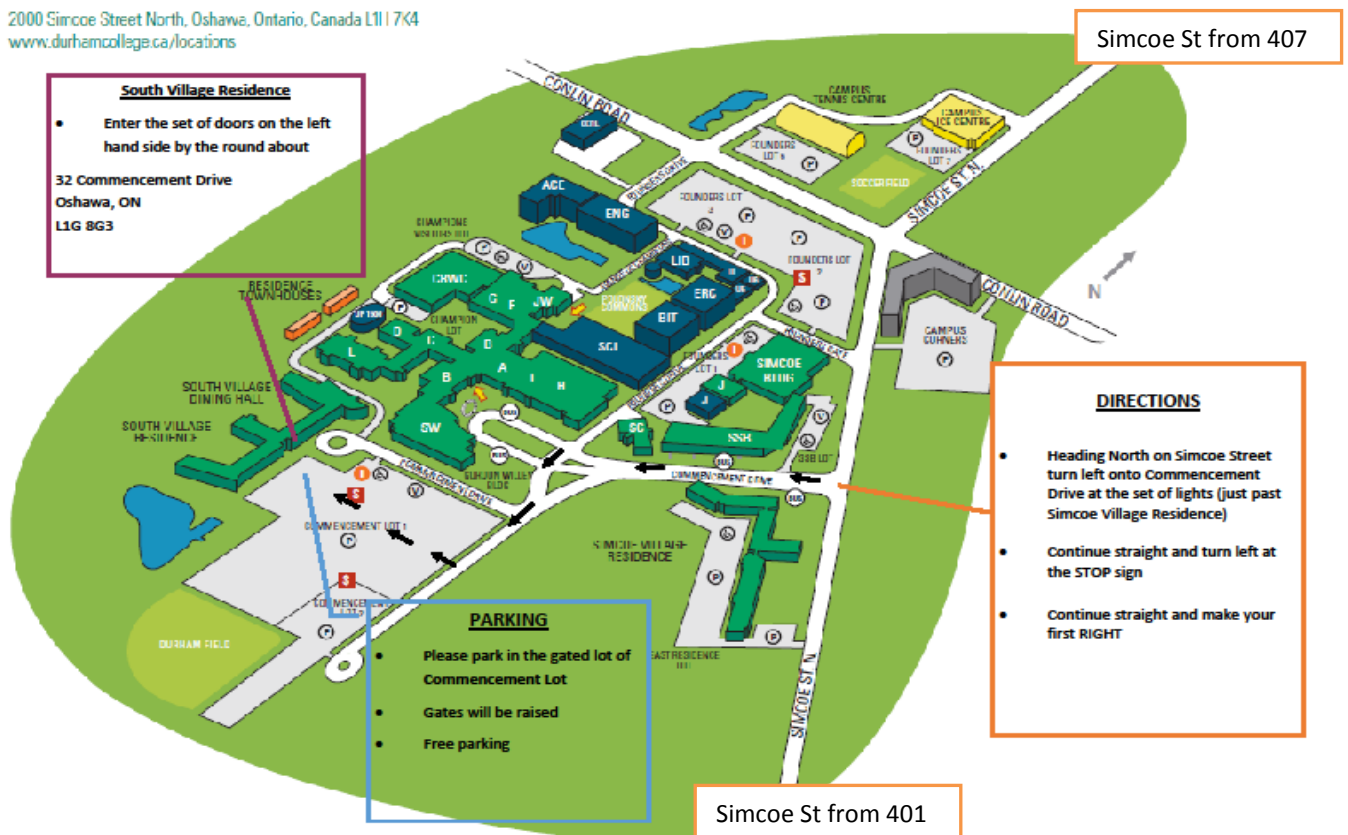


## Directions to UOIT/DC Campus:

- **GO train** Lakeshore East to Whitby station then Durham Regional Transit 910 bus to UOIT campus
- **From Highway 401 eastbound**, exit Simcoe St., Oshawa (interchange 417) north to UOIT campus, turn in at Commencement Drive entrance
- **From Highway 401 westbound**, exit Ritson Rd., Oshawa (interchange 418). This exit requires you follow the exit street (Drew) to the lights at Drew & McNaughton Avenue, turn left at lights, proceed to Simcoe then turn right/ north to UOIT campus, turn in at Commencement Drive entrance
- **From Highway 407**, exit Simcoe St., Oshawa (interchange 124) south to UOIT campus, turn in at Commencement Drive entrance
- Free parking in Commencement lot

## Directions to Robert McLaughlin Gallery (72 Queen St.) from UOIT

Exit the university and proceed south on Simcoe St. As Simcoe eventually becomes one way northbound you will veer to the right and proceed onto Centre St. South. Drive a short distance south and then turn right at Bagot St. (at public library). The Art Gallery will be directly in front of you. Free parking is available.
