A. Background

I am applying for the position of Regional Director, Ontario North. I have served in this position for half a term since May, 2019 (a vacancy occurred) and would like to continue for another two-year term. I was born in Northern Ontario and have traveled extensively in the area so I know the demographic well. I have only just begun to learn about the clubs in my region and have sincerely enjoyed the experience and that of serving on the OC Board. I would like to continue to connect with my clubs, help when needed, promote sharing amongst the clubs, encourage advocacy, promote education and all endeavors that improve the lives of women and girls, and to act as a liaison to ensure that the clubs receive and understand information from and the commitments and actions of our National and Provincial Councils. Membership has been a key goal for me during this term. I have conducted a simple survey amongst my regional clubs to try to determine how we can attract more members and developed a mentoring program to help retain new members so I am hoping to continue to work on these and similar projects and to support the Ontario North clubs.

For 3 years I was Coordinator of CFUW Orillia Homes Tour, CFUW Orillia's major fundraiser, heading a committee of 15 members. This project raises around \$20,000 for scholarships each year. I am currently on the Advocacy committee and working on Resolutions, and Co-chair of Publicity.
- Provincially, I was on the Planning Committee and served as the Registrar for the 2015 Ontario North Fall Gathering and have been the Regional Director for Ontario North since May 2019.

- Classroom teacher for 20+ years (Secondary English, Core French in Middle School and Junior High, Special Education) serving as Team Leader for several years. (in Manitoba)
- Taught ESL at the Adult Learning Centre in Winnipeg, Manitoba
- Taught ESL and developed programs for students from ages 5-18 in my own School Division
- Worked on many curriculum development committees, primarily in language arts, during my years as a teacher and saw the work implemented in our school division.
- Secretary for Community Club for 3 years
- Managed a campaign for a colleague running for City Council
- Moved to Ontario and conducted my own Sales Business for 3 years.
- Worked with my husband in Sales Business for 15 years, traveling throughout northern Ontario.

- I have chaired and served on several committees where planning skills are a necessity.
