



Lorna Marsden is a sociologist and university administrator. She was born on Vancouver Island and graduated from the University of Toronto (BA, 1967) and Princeton University (PhD, 1972). For twenty years she was on the faculty and held administrative positions at the University of Toronto before being appointed to the Senate of Canada by PM Pierre Trudeau (1984-72). There she served on and chaired the Committee on Social Affairs and was vice-chair of the Canada-Europe Parliamentary Association. In 1992 she became President and Vice-Chancellor of Wilfrid Laurier University and in 1997-2007 President and Vice-Chancellor of York University.

She joined the Ontario Committee on the Status of Women in 1971 and served as the third president of the National Action Committee on the Status of Women (1975-77) and has been an active feminist. Her most recent book, with Beth Atcheson, is *White Gloves Off! The Work of the Ontario Committee on the Status of Women* (in the Feminist History Society series, Second Story Press, 2018) and she is also the author of *Canadian Women and the Struggle for Equality*, Oxford University Press, 2012 and many other scholarly books, articles and reviews. She has served on several corporate and not-for-profit boards and was most recently the Chair of the Board of the Gardiner Museum in Toronto. She has received many awards including the Order of Canada, the Order of Ontario, the Order of Merit (FRG) and six honorary doctorates. She has been married to Professor Edward Harvey for 58 years.
